## Camp Rules

---

Thank you in advance for your cooperation in following these rules. We try to keep the rules to a minimum and have designed them to keep everyone safe and happy!

🐾 **LEASHES:** Dogs must be leashed in common camp grounds and cabin areas. There are designated off leash areas. Check your map for the locations. There are signs at the boundary of the off leash areas.

🐾 **SMOKING:** There is no smoking in any camp building. Please dispose of matches and cigarette butts in appropriate trash cans.

🐾 **ALCOHOL:** No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the campgrounds.

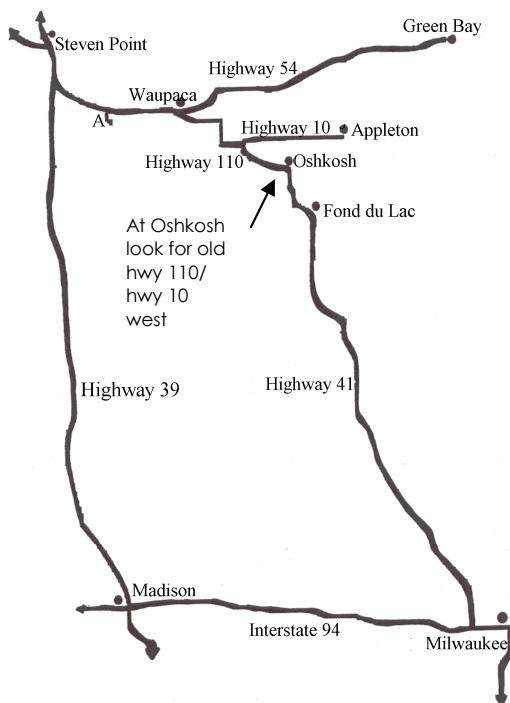
🐾 **WATER FRONT:** A life guard is on duty when the water front is open. The water front is closed to human swimming when the lifeguard isn't present. The life guard will be happy to assist you with anything you need at the water front. Swimmers are encouraged to use the buddy system.

🐾 **POOP-SCOOPING:** It the responsibility of the owners to clean up after their dogs. Poop buckets will be placed around the camp, and plastic "hand" bags will be available.

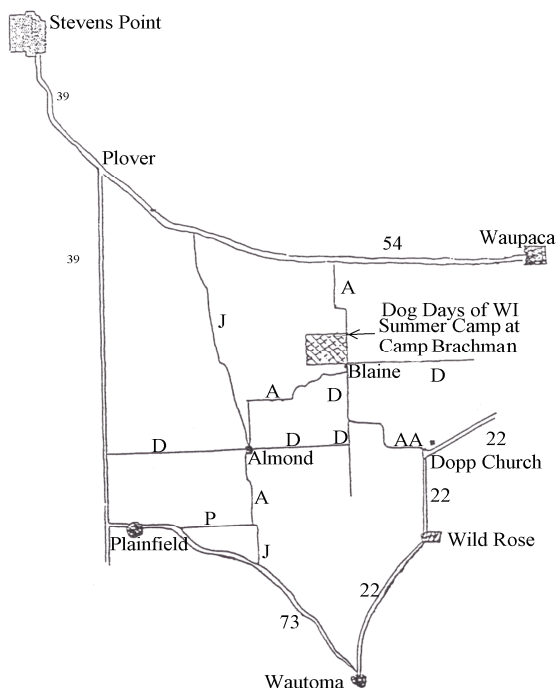
🐾 **TWO DOG RULE:** Two dogs are allowed with you unless you are unable to control them effectively. One complaint and you will be required to have only one dog out at a time.

After you exit Highway 39 onto D and get to Almond or Highway 54 onto A you will see additional signs directing you to camp. Both A and D are county roads in good condition.

Directions from:

Milwaukee: Hwy 45/Hwy 41 north until they split (around Germantown). When they split, take Hwy 41 north to Fond du Lac then continue on Hwy 41 north to Osh Kosh. Take exit 120 (45 north) in Osh Kosh for approximately 12 miles (to 10 west). Take 10 west to Hwy 54 (Waupaca). 54 west to Hwy A. A south to Asbury Dr.

Madison: Hwy 39 north to Hwy 54. 54 east to Hwy A. A south to Asbury Dr.

Green Bay: Hwy 54 west to Hwy A. A south to Asbury Dr.

Appleton: Hwy 10 west to Hwy 54 (Waupaca). 54 west to Hwy A. A south to Asbury Dr.

Stevens Point: Hwy 39 south to Hwy 54. 54 east to Hwy A. A south to Asbury Dr.

Minn/St. Paul: Hwy 94 east to 29. Hwy 29 east to Hwy 39 (Wausau). Hwy 39 south to Hwy 54. 54 east to Hwy A. A south to Asbury Dr.

Chicago: Hwy 94 north to Milwaukee. After the airport look for Interstate 894 around the southern part of the city. Then take Hwy 45 north which will then combine with Hwy 41 north. Stay on Hwy 45/Hwy 41 north until they split (around Germantown). When they split, take Hwy 41 north to Fond du Lac then continue on Hwy 41 north to Osh Kosh. Take exit 120 (45 north) in Osh Kosh for approximately 12 miles (to 10 west). Take 10 west to Hwy 54 (Waupaca). 54 west to Hwy A. Hwy A south to Asbury Dr.
